Welland, ON – Dan Degazio, who served the City of Welland for over 30 years as both a councillor and employee, retired in the spring of this year, but his work is still being recognized.

In addition to City duties, Degazio was an active member of EDCO and a driving force of the EDCO Investment Alliance.

"EDCO's 1,100 members are dedicated professionals who work tirelessly to enhance their local economies, quality of life and investment opportunities," read part of the statement in a letter sent to City Hall. "To be selected as a Top Ten demonstrates the level of achievement that Mr. Degazio reached. EDCO is proud to have the City of Welland as members."
