

Welland Transit increasing services as of Sept. 5

Welland, ON – Riders of Welland Transit can expect a return to full services beginning Sunday, September 5.

Transit, operating under reduced services during the recent steps of the province’s Roadmap to Recovery plan, brought 30-minute service back within the city during peak blocks on August 15.

“We’re excited to welcome you back to transit,” said Edward Zahra, transit manager. “We’re ramping up services for riders and getting them back to a more regular, frequent schedule which will help them get back to enjoying the city and accessing important services.”

The upcoming service changes provide operations Monday to Friday from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m., Saturday from 6 a.m. – 10 p.m., and Sunday and Holidays from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. These hours also accommodate cooling/warming centre provisions.

Welland Transit continues to offer free rides to individuals travelling for their COVID-19 vaccination appointments.

- Seaway Mall (800 Niagara St., Welland)

Welland Transit uses the Transit Mobile app, giving riders access to real-time bus schedules and other helpful information at their fingertips. The user-friendly app uses GPS software to display routes in the user’s immediate area, indicating arrival times and allowing riders to manage their schedules better.

Riders are encouraged to share their transit experiences on social media, using #WelcomeBackWelland or #WellandTransit as services return to full operations and provide residents with an economical and environmentally-friendly option to get to where they live, work, and play.
